SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Emergency Extension Act of 1985".

SEC. 2. 45-DAY EXTENSION OF INCREASE IN TAX ON CIGARETTES.

Subsection (c) of section 283 of the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 (relating to increase in tax on cigarettes) is amended by striking out "October 1, 1985" and inserting in lieu thereof "November 15, 1985".

SEC. 4. 45-DAY EXTENSION OF BORROWING AUTHORITY UNDER THE RAILROAD UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT.

(a) MAINTAINING EXISTING HOSPITAL PAYMENT RATES.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the amount of payment under section 1886 of the Social Security Act for inpatient hospital services 42 USC 1395ww. for discharges occurring (and cost reporting periods beginning) during the extension period (as defined in subsection (c)) shall be determined on the same basis as the amount of payment for such services for a discharge occurring on (or the cost reporting period beginning immediately on or before) September 30, 1985.

(b) Maintaining Existing Payment Rates for Physicians' Serv-ICES.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the amount of payment under part B of title XVIII of the Social Security Act for physicians' services which are furnished during the extension period (as defined in subsection (c)) shall be determined on the same basis as the amount of payment for such services furnished on September 30, 1985, and the 15-month period, referred to in section 1842(i)(1) of such Act, shall be deemed to include the extension period.
